How to Use This Guide

This guide is designed to be your friendly companion – not a rigid rulebook. Engagement photos should feel like **you**, not a magazine spread. Here's how to get the most out of these pages:

-  **Read through once** – get familiar with the prompts and ideas.
-  **Share with your partner** – pick 5-6 poses that feel authentic to you both.
-  **Save your favorites** – screenshot or bookmark the prompts you love.
-  **Share with your photographer** – they'll love knowing your vision.

 **Pro tip:** The best photos happen when you forget the camera exists. Use these prompts as a starting point, then let your connection take over.



15 Natural Posing Prompts

No stiff poses. Just gentle directions that spark real interaction.

- 1. Walk toward me hand-in-hand, talking about your first date.
- 2. Stand nose-to-nose, eyes closed, then slowly open and smile.
- 3. Piggyback ride + lots of laughter.
- 4. Whisper something silly in each other's ear.
- 5. Forehead kiss while holding hands.
- 6. Dance together – no music needed.
- 7. Sit back-to-back, then lean heads together.
- 8. Tickle fight (yes, really!).
- 9. Look at each other like you just fell in love.
- 10. Hold her from behind, chin on her shoulder.
- 11. Walk away from camera, then look back over shoulder.
- 12. Share an inside joke – the real laugh is magic.
- 13. Play with his tie / her hair.
- 14. Dip kiss (support her back!).
- 15. Hold hands, close your eyes, breathe together.

 **Remember:** Movement = natural photos. Walk, twirl, sit, stand – keep flowing.

Posing Tips by Photography Style

Lifestyle & Documentary

Forget the camera exists. Interact as you normally would – cook together, read on the couch, take a walk.

Fine Art & Editorial

Think elegant movement. Flowing dresses, wind in hair, looking away from camera. Less smile, more mystery.

Adventure & Destination

Use the landscape. Sit on cliff edges, hold hands while hiking, embrace after a summit. Let nature lead.

Documentary

Zero posing. Just live your day – make breakfast, walk your dog, cuddle on the sofa. The photographer follows.

Vintage & Retro

Channel old Hollywood. Hand on hip, leaning on a classic car, dramatic shadows. Soft smiles, strong eye contact.

Urban & City

Use architecture. Lean against brick walls, walk through crosswalks, sit on fire escapes. High energy, modern.

Seasonal & Holiday

Embrace the elements. Catch snowflakes, throw autumn leaves, hold hot cocoa. Let the season be your co-star.



What to Wear: Style-by-Style Guide

 **Lifestyle:** Casual and comfy. Jeans, knits, sundresses, bare feet.


 **Fine Art:** Elegant and flowy. Long gowns, tailored suits, velvet, lace.


 **Adventure:** Functional and cute. Hiking boots, jackets, beanies, flannel.

 **Documentary:** Your everyday favorites. What you'd wear on a Saturday.

 **Vintage:** Thrifted and timeless. Polka dots, leather jackets, suspenders, pearls.









 **Urban:** Sleek and modern. Neutral tones, blazers, little black dress, cool sneakers.

 **Seasonal:** Match the season. Pastels for spring, warm earth tones for fall, cozy sweaters for winter.

 **Color tip:** Avoid busy patterns and neon. Stick to complementary tones – not matching, but harmonizing.

Location Scouting Checklist

Use this before you commit to a spot.

Session Timeline: 1.5 Hours

0:00 - 0:15 – Arrive early, get comfortable, discuss shot list with photographer.

0:15 - 0:30 – Warm-up poses (walking, standing, simple prompts).

0:30 - 0:50 – First outfit main set (your favorite location).

0:50 - 1:05 – Outfit change + second location (within walking distance).

1:05 - 1:20 – Second outfit – more intimate or playful prompts.

1:20 - 1:30 – Sunset / golden hour magic shots.



Pro tip: Add 30 minutes if you have more than 2 locations or outfits.



10 Questions to Ask Your Photographer

- 1. Have you shot at our chosen location before?
 - 2. Can we see a full gallery from a recent engagement shoot?
 - 3. What's your posing style (directed vs. documentary)?
 - 4. When will we receive our edited photos?
 - 5. Do you offer print rights / digital downloads?
 - 6. What happens if it rains?
 - 7. Can we bring our dog / prop?
 - 8. Do you help with wardrobe or timeline advice?
 - 9. What's your backup plan if you're sick?
 - 10. Can we share unedited sneak peeks?
